PASTORAL LETTER

Dear friends,



Our God, the God of Abraham and Sarah, of Ruth and Jonah gives stability over the ages, continuity and peace, and equally calls us out to follow him into unknown land. The one who continually re-creates the world every morning calls us out to leave our fisher nets behind and

go, trusting that our lives and the lives of others will be richer for it.

I can see God at work in our Forest Group, encouraging us to trust Him and His ways for us.

At Woodford church we are exploring the possibility of joining up with the East London and Essex Liberal Synagogue (currently in South Woodford), with whom we might embark on the journey of a joint future in using the building both as Synagogue and as Church, and possibly also becoming the new home for the London Interfaith Centre, which currently is in NW London, but due to close next summer. This would be a very exciting new beginning and a great sign for the local (and farther) community, that God is One, but can be worshipped in different ways. That religions can work together and be friends, and that we can learn from each other about our God. Please hold us all in your prayer as we continue our conversations both with Synagogue and Synod. I can see God at work at St James, with Gerald and Mariana breathing new wind into church and congregation; their faith and humour refreshing our gatherings and inspiring us to think wider.

And in Chingford I see God at work in church members taking on more of what used to be the church secretary's responsibilities, enabling the church to share and work more as a team. "See, I am making all things new." (Rev 21,5) And in the church's decision to re-organise their lettings system; in asking something new to develop and embracing that.

At our Joint FG Elders Day coming up on 15 June we will be looking to discern a vision for our churches, for our Group. This will carry us into the future that God holds for us, help us focus and guide our actions.

Where do *you* see God at work in our communities? Do look out for it, and share with us!



ARTICLES REFLECTION: <u>Biblical Teaching – Part 2</u>

As we continue with our Holy Habit of Biblical Teaching, I would like to suggest that the Bible is a bit like a school mathematics text book. In the front of the text-book are all the problems, and in the back are the answers. However, in the case of the Bible, there is only one problem and one solution. The problem is sin and the Old Testament describes this in terrible detail, and the answer is Jesus's death on the cross, which we see in the New Testament. A drastic solution to an intractable problem that only God Himself could solve.

In the Garden of Eden, as soon as Adam and Eve sin, we start to see consequences. It had never bothered them before that they were naked, they experienced fear, they hide from God, and enmity is born, pain is increased, work becomes toil. In the next generation, we see envy and murder (Genesis 3 and 4). All of the world's problems are ultimately the result of sin. Ever since then, men and women everywhere have been unable to return to that original sinless state which is necessary for a relationship with a perfect God.

Before the creation of the world, God had planned the solution to the problem that He knew would come. He knew what it would cost, and only Jesus could carry it out. "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" Matt 20:28. We cannot even believe without the Holy Spirit within us, we are so helpless to save ourselves. Let's worship God for His gracious kindness in rescuing us. Kevin Haigh

CHURCH MEETING NOTES APRIL 2019

Our April Church Meeting was chaired by Louise Woodcock and was attended by sixteen people. News of the church family was exchanged before moving on to other matters.

Our new Hall Manager, Gerald Lee, has now completed his three month probationary period and the Elders confirmed his appointment at their last meeting. It was agreed Gerald and Mariana should be brought into membership of St. James' on Sunday 5th May. Gerald has been busy clearing out the storage shed behind the garage and some of the machinery inside it has been sent to a charity in Africa which can make use of these items. The church basement has been cleared out too, so the Scouts can use that space, and two of our Elders spent several hours sorting out old church archives which had been stored in boxes there and also the contents of an old wooden filing cabinet. It was decided that most of the material should go to the local history museum at Waltham Abbey, where it can be collated and stored in suitable conditions. Some old photographs have been retained by church members and copies of old music sheets may be of interest to some other people.

The Russell Road fence saga is on-going, but hopefully the matter will be settled soon.

The Quiet Day and the Good Friday Meditation had been appreciated by all those who attended and may be repeated next year. The Craft Group at its next meeting will be making decorated post cards to be used in the URC tent at the *Greenbelt Festival* at the end of August and banners for displaying in church may be made at a later date.

It was decided we should have three Summer Garden Parties: in July at the home of Louise and Simon Woodcock, in August at the home of Eileen and Geoff Packe and in September at the home of Jenny Chapman. Dates for these have still to be finalised.

At their next meeting, the Elders will check our updated Church Profile and then provide copies for any church member who wishes to scrutinise it.

An email had been received from Heather Scholer, who is in charge of Epping Forest Food Bank, announcing that 1,461 three-day emergency food parcels had been given out to local people in the past year, an increase of 22% from the previous year. Fifteen tonnes of food had been donated. We will continue to support the Food Bank with our Sacramental Offertory in June and our Harvest Gifts in September.

The Church Secretary had been to to visit Christ Church, Newham on its Open Day on Saturday 27th April to get a glimpse of its rebuilding programme and hopes for the future. She had also recently delivered a letter, as advised by Christian Aid, to HSBC Bank in Loughton asking them to make the *Big Shift* out of fossil fuels into renewable energy.

Margaret Minoletti was hoping to attend the CND Service outside Westminster Abbey on 3rd May led by Bruce Kent to protest against the Royal Navy's Service of Thanksgiving to mark 50 years of *Continuous at Sea Deterrent* taking place then.

Some of us will be collecting for Christian Aid outside Buckhurst Hill Station on May 17th, so let's hope we will be successful in raising funds to help mothers in Sierra Leone give birth safely.
