ARTICLES REFLECTION: <u>Biblical Teaching</u>

In our Holy Habits home-groups, we are starting on the topic of Biblical Teaching. At the time of Acts 2, none of the New Testament books had been written, so they were being taught by the Apostles and this teaching was later written down in the pages of the New Testament.

Much of this teaching explained how the Old Testament was pointing to God's Messiah and how Jesus fulfilled the prophesies. Jesus himself read from Isaiah in the synagogue in Nazareth and claimed that He was the fulfillment of it (Luke 4:21). This would have been dynamite to the Jews. All through the gospels, you can see the excitement building with its climax in the Acts as people became convinced of Jesus's identity as God's promised Messiah, and the church spread like wildfire, despite ferocious opposition.

Why should we place so much importance on Biblical Teaching, rather than on church tradition and authority, on our own spiritual experiences, or on our own unassisted reasoning? It is because it tells people what they need, but do not want to hear. How many attempts have there been to discredit, twist or soften the words of the Bible, so as to avoid the conclusion that we each of us need the forgiveness of sins that only God can grant through the barbaric means of Jesus's sacrifice on the cross? Do we ourselves soften the teaching, because we are afraid of making ourselves unpopular or ridiculous? We would never have come up with teaching like that on our own. The Bible is precious treasure, and we need to be on a lifelong quest to learn its secrets. It is how we come to know God and receive life from Him.

CHURCH MEETING NOTES MARCH 2019

Our March Church Meeting was chaired by Louise Woodcock and was attended by thirteen people. News of the church family was exchanged before moving on to other matters.

The Russell Road fence saga is on-going, but hopefully the matter will be settled soon. Our new Hall Manager, Gerald Lee, has now completed his three month probationary period and the Elders will confirm his appointment at their next meeting. Gerald now liaises with the uniformed organisations regarding parade services which is helpful.

As we are an eco-congregation, *Operation Noah's* challenge to ensure the church's investments are ethical will be considered by the Treasurer.

Holy Habits groups are continuing and the group which meets in the Church Room on the second Monday morning of the month is going well, as are the Lent Study Groups on Wednesday mornings and on Thursday evenings. The film *Risen* was shown in the Church Room

at 5.00pm on Saturday 30th March and was appreciated by those who attended.

Plans for the Mothering Sunday Parade Service were discussed, with members of the uniformed organisatons being asked to help with readings and distribution of flowers.

Help is needed with the ecumenical pre-Easter commuter outreach at Buckhurst Hill Station which will take place in Holy Week, with donations for hot cross buns being welcome.

Volunteers are also needed for Christian Aid collecting at Buckhurst Hill station on Friday 17th May from 7.30 am - 8.30 am and again from 5.00pm - 6.30pm. With the station now havng step-free access there are three exits /entrances, so we will have to spread ourselves around to do the collection.

A *Thanksgiving Dinner* for hall users and church members is to be held on Saturday 23rd November and our Hall Manager suggested we should advertise church events on sandwich boards at the end of the driveway in future. He also put forward the idea that part of the church entrance area could be used as a Prayer Space for passing visitors and the Church Room could be used more frequently as a place of prayer.

So, we have lots of challenges and ideas about engaging more with our local community, many of whom use our premises but as yet do not worship with us.

CLOSURE OF JIMMY'S CONTACT CENTRE

We had a training afternoon at St. James' on Saturday 30th March and at the end of the meeting we made the decision to close the Contact Centre at the end of March 2020. This decision was then accepted by our Minister and Elders, who form the management Committee of Jimmy's at the Elders' meeting on 1st April.

We have offered almost 25years of service to families who have split up, by providing them a safe place where the non-resident parent can meet their child/children. The Contact Centre was set up in July 1995 by Ros Mills, one of our Elders and a local magistrate, who recognised the need for such a centre and saw St. James' as being an ideal place to have one, having good transport links and suitable premises.

At first we had lots of families attending with a long waiting list, and many referrals from solicitors, but now Legal Aid has been cut, the number of referrals has diminished, with only four families attending at present and no waiting list.

We have to belong to NACCC, the National Association of Child Contact Centres, which involves paying a considerable amount of money in membership fees and annual insurance cover. We have to be accredited by NACCC every three years and our current accreditation runs out in November 2020. Being re-accredited involves a great deal of work for the Co-ordinators who do not wish to go through the process again.

At present we have thirteen volunteers including the two coordinators, all getting older with two planning to move away. All these factors have, sadly, made us make the decision to close, but we feel over the years we have made a valuable contribution to society and now is the right time to make plans for closure.

All the volunteers deserve thanks for their years of faithful service and commitment, some having served for over twenty years.
